

Tour of Breskens

Breskens has been a genuine fishing village for many years, and you can feel and taste that everywhere. It is still wonderful to stroll through the harbour area (note: at the Plus supermarket, you need to be on the other side of the dyke). There you will find the fishing museum, among other things.

If you enjoy spotting seals, be sure to take a trip on the Festijn. This boat regularly sails out to bring tourists close to the seals. It's great fun.

Tip 1: do this when the weather is nice, as it is an open boat.

Tip 2: book online in advance, as it is often fully booked. Check www.defestijn.nl



Restaurant Amuse is located on Spuiplein (in the centre). It has a perfect atmosphere and offers a great combination of fresh fish and excellent wines.

Be sure to keep an eye on the events calendar in the Badkoerier. Breskens is a lively and active village, and events such as fairs, herring festivals and, of course, fishing festivals are organised regularly.

From Breskens, you can take the ferry (bike and foot ferry) to Vlissingen. It's nice to make the crossing to “the other side” once in a while.

Or you can cycle back over the dike towards Groede-Nieuwvliet. On the way, you will come across the Waterdunen nature reserve. This is a newly created nature reserve that is well worth a visit. Please note that you are not allowed to cycle in the area. It can only be accessed on foot. Unfortunately, dogs are also not allowed. You can walk along paths and boardwalks and watch the seabirds from bird hides.
