

Visit to Bruges

If you ask us, Bruges is an absolute must-see!

This city is half an hour away by car and is FANTASTIC. The medieval architecture in Bruges has remained largely intact, making it one of the best-preserved medieval cities in Europe. The old buildings, bridges and winding alleys offer cosiness and atmosphere. It is not for nothing that Bruges is also called the “Venice of the North”.

There is plenty to do in Bruges. You can enjoy a leisurely tour by horse and carriage or hop on a canal boat to explore the city's waterways. At the tourist information point on the Market Square, you can pick up various city walking tours that you can do on your own. Or you can simply go shopping or wander around at your leisure.

Tip: the Historium is located on the Market Square. This cultural-historical attraction allows you to experience how Bruges flourished during the Golden Age. They have set it up in a very entertaining way, based on a themed story in which the young assistant of the famous painter Jan van Eyck falls in love. You can also take an impressive tour of the old city with VR glasses. Great fun!

Beer lover? On Wollestraat, you will find the Beerwall. This is a next-level craft beer café: they sell beers from all corners of the world, which you can then drink on a terrace overlooking the water. Nice!
